good because the fish keep our lakes clean. It's a very sensitive ecosystem/cycle that we have. If you happen to see anyone; residents, contractors, etc. dumping harmful waste into your drains please notify Community Services immediately. Thank you for your help.

Recycling

RCI is actively looking at the cost of expanding the trash/recycling bin area by the car wash. Currently RCI has two trash bins, two paper bins and two 35 gallon waste bins for aluminum (blue) and plastic/glass (red), respectively. The cost would be in tearing down the current wall on the north side and expanding this area by two parking lot spaces. Next we would need to have that asphalt removed along with the dirt. Once that portion is complete contractors would then rebuild the wall to include the extended area. The city of Scottsdale could provide this service but it would come with a charge. I am exploring having a third party provide the community recycling bins at no charge. Email me and let me know your thoughts on this. Do you want your community to be more active in recycling glass/plastic? I heard on the news the other day that by the year 2050 there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish! I don't know who authored this statistic, but if it's true that is devastating.

Reverse 911

As technology improves more people are getting rid of their landlines. I believe I gave up my landline over 10 years ago. I remember thinking how scary it was to trust the cell phone to work properly if an emergency ever occurred, but we never looked back. Back in 2004 a program called *Reverse 911* was launched through Maricopa County. Any public safety threats, flash floods, fires, hazardous material spills, police incidents, amber alert or silver alert are sent to your cell phone, this ser-

vice was previously only available to landline phones. The amount of people signing up via cell phones has been very low to this point. If you would like to register your phone visit www.911alertsyou.com and follow the prompts on the screen. You could also google "reverse 911 Scottsdale" for more information.

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

CENS (also known as Reverse 911) is the community Emergency Notification System. The system is designed to rapidly notify an affected area of an emergency by sending a recorded message through the telephone system.


